



Kentucky Division of Fire Prevention/State Fire Marshal Certified Fire Inspector I and II Course Descriptions

KENTUCKY CERTIFIED STATE FIRE INSPECTOR I

This class is the first step in the fire marshal's Fire Inspector Certification Program. Fire and building code officials will benefit from this course. This class provides instruction based on the 2012 NFPA fire codes, the Kentucky Standards of Safety (815 KAR 10:060) and the Kentucky Building Code (KBC). Building code officials learn basic principles of a fire inspection program and how it relates to the KBC. This class consists of two days of instruction followed by an exam. Students are encouraged to bring a calculator and the currently adopted NFPA 101 (Life Safety Code) and NFPA 1 (Fire Code).

Course Objectives

- Prepare attendees to conduct inspections of buildings for fire hazards and code compliance per 815 KAR 10:060 (The Kentucky Standards of Safety).
- Determine that fire protective equipment is adequate, operational and maintained.
- Determine the adequacy of exits and, where required, that emergency fire evacuation drills are held.
- Advise property owners of the inspector's findings.
- Gain an understanding of projects that must be approved by the Division of Building Code Enforcement and other divisions within the Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction.

This is a 2-day course offers 12 hours of continuing education for fire safety and building code certification.

KENTUCKY CERTIFIED STATE FIRE INSPECTOR II

This class is the second step in the fire marshal's revised Inspector Certification Program. This class is designed for fire inspectors and building code officials who deal with more difficult life safety and building safety issues daily. Students will get detailed instruction on all use group requirements, design occupant load, and seating arrangements. This class consists of instruction followed by an exam. Students are encouraged to bring a calculator.

Course Objectives

- Attendees will be instructed in the performance of and requirements for complex fire inspections and code recognition.
- Gain valuable knowledge in occupant load calculation and seating arrangement in places of assembly, fair and exposition centers and special events.

PRE-REQUISITES/EQUIPMENT NEEDED

Pre-requisite for this class is Fire Inspector I certification. This 2-day course offers 12 hours of continuing education for fire safety and building code certification.
